## The Psalm or Psalms Appointed

### **Psalm 9** *Confitebor tibi*

*The LORD is enthroned for ever; he has set up his throne for judgment, hallelujah.*

<sup>1</sup> I will give thanks to you, O LORD, with my whole heart; \*  
I will tell of all your marvelous works.

<sup>2</sup> I will be glad and rejoice in you; \*  
I will sing to your Name, O Most High.

<sup>3</sup> When my enemies are driven back, \*  
they will stumble and perish at your presence.

<sup>4</sup> For you have maintained my right and my cause; \*  
you sit upon your throne judging right.  
<sup>5</sup> You have rebuked the ungodly and destroyed the wicked; \*  
you have blotted out their name for ever and ever.  
<sup>6</sup> As for the enemy, they are finished, in perpetual ruin, \*  
their cities plowed under, the memory of them perished;  
<sup>7</sup> But the LORD is enthroned for ever; \*  
he has set up his throne for judgment.  
<sup>8</sup> It is he who rules the world with righteousness; \*  
he judges the peoples with equity.  
<sup>9</sup> The LORD will be a refuge for the oppressed, \*  
a refuge in time of trouble.  
<sup>10</sup> Those who know your Name will put their trust in you, \*  
for you never forsake those who seek you, O LORD.

### **Psalm 9 (cont.)**

<sup>12</sup> The Avenger of blood will remember them; \*  
he will not forget the cry of the afflicted.  
<sup>13</sup> Have pity on me, O LORD; \*  
see the misery I suffer from those who hate me, O you who lift me up from the gate of death;  
<sup>14</sup> So that I may tell of all your praises and rejoice in your salvation \*  
in the gates of the city of Zion.  
<sup>15</sup> The ungodly have fallen into the pit they dug, \*  
and in the snare they set is their own foot caught.  
<sup>16</sup> The LORD is known by his acts of justice; \*  
the wicked are trapped in the works of their own hands.  
<sup>17</sup> The wicked shall be given over to the grave, \*  
and also all the people that forget God.  
<sup>18</sup> For the needy shall not always be forgotten, \*  
and the hope of the poor shall not perish for ever.  
<sup>19</sup> Rise up, O LORD, let not the ungodly have the upper hand; \*  
let them be judged before you.  
<sup>20</sup> Put fear upon them, O LORD; \*  
let the ungodly know they are but mortal.

### **Psalm 129** *Sæpe expugnaverunt*

*I know you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, hallelujah.*

- <sup>1</sup> Greatly have they oppressed me since my youth, \*  
let Israel now say;  
<sup>2</sup> Greatly have they oppressed me since my youth", \*  
but they have not prevailed against me."  
<sup>3</sup> The plowmen plowed upon my back \*  
and made their furrows long.  
<sup>4</sup> The LORD, the Righteous One, \*  
has cut the cords of the wicked.  
<sup>5</sup> Let them be put to shame and thrown back, \*  
all those who are enemies of Zion.  
<sup>6</sup> Let them be like grass upon the housetops, \*  
which withers before it can be plucked;  
<sup>7</sup> Which does not fill the hand of the reaper, \*  
nor the bosom of him who binds the sheaves;  
<sup>8</sup> So that those who go by say not so much as, "The LORD prosper you. \*  
We wish you well in the Name of the LORD."

## **The Lessons**

A reading from Matthew 6:25-34 (NRSV)

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you-- you of little faith? Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What

will we wear?' For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. "So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today.

Here ends the Reading.
