The Invitatory and Psalter

V: Lord, open our lips.

R: And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.

Alleluia

Christ our Passover *Pascha nostrum* 1 Corinthians 5:7-8; Romans 6:9-11; 1 Corinthians 15:20-22

Alleluia. Christ our Passover has been sacrificed for us; * therefore let us keep the feast, Not with the old leaven, the leaven of malice and evil, * but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. Alleluia. Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; * death no longer has dominion over him. The death that he died, he died to sin, once for all; * but the life he lives, he lives to God. So also consider yourselves dead to sin, * and alive to God in Jesus Christ our Lord. Alleluia. Christ has been raised from the dead, * the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since by a man came death, * by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, * so also in Christ shall all be made alive. Alleluia.

¹ As the deer longs for the water-brooks, * so longs my soul for you, O God. ² My soul is athirst for God, athirst for the living God; * when shall I come to appear before the presence of God? ³ My tears have been my food day and night, * while all day long they say to me, "Where now is your God?" ⁴ I pour out my soul when I think on these things; * how I went with the multitude and led them into the house of God, ⁵ With the voice of praise and thanksgiving, * among those who keep holy-day. ⁶ Why are you so full of heaviness, O my soul? * and why are you so disquieted within me? ⁷ Put your trust in God; * for I will yet give thanks to him, who is the help of my countenance, and my God. ⁸ My soul is heavy within me; * therefore I will remember you from the land of Jordan, and from the peak of Mizar among the heights of Hermon. ⁹ One deep calls to another in the noise of your cataracts; * all your rapids and floods have gone over me. ¹⁰ The LORD grants his loving-kindness in the daytime; * in the night season his song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life. You have restored my life, O Lord, hallelujah. ¹ I will exalt you, O LORD, because you have lifted me up * and have not let my enemies triumph over me. ² O LORD my God, I cried out to you, * and you restored me to health. ³ You brought me up, O LORD, from the dead; * you restored my life as I was going down to the grave. ⁴ Sing to the LORD, you servants of his; * give thanks for the remembrance of his holiness. ⁵ For his wrath endures but the twinkling of an eye, * his favor for a lifetime. ⁶ Weeping may spend the night. * but joy comes in the morning. ⁷ While I felt secure, I said, "I shall never be disturbed. * You, LORD, with your favor, made me as strong as the mountains." ⁸ Then you hid your face, * and I was filled with fear. ⁹ I cried to you, O LORD; * I pleaded with the Lord, saying, $^{10}\,$ What profit is there in my blood, if I go down to the Pit? * will the dust praise you or declare your faithfulness? ¹¹ Hear, O LORD, and have mercy upon me; * O LORD, be my helper." ¹² You have turned my wailing into dancing; * you have put off my sack-cloth and clothed me with jov. ¹³ Therefore my heart sings to you without ceasing; * O LORD my God, I will give you thanks for ever.

⁴ Praise him with timbrel and dance; * praise him with strings and pipe.
⁵ Praise him with resounding cymbals; * praise him with loud-clanging cymbals.
⁶ Let everything that has breath * praise the Lord. Hallelujah!

The Lessons

A reading from Daniel 6:16-28 (NRSV)

Then the king gave the command, and Daniel was brought and thrown into the den of lions. The king said to Daniel, "May your God, whom you faithfully serve, deliver you!" A stone was brought and laid on the mouth of the den, and the king sealed it with his own signet and with the signet of his lords, so that nothing might be changed concerning Daniel. Then the king went to his palace and spent the night fasting; no food was brought to him, and sleep fled from him. Then, at break of day, the king got up and hurried to the den of lions. When he came near the den where Daniel was, he cried out anxiously to Daniel, "O Daniel, servant of the living God, has your God whom you faithfully serve been able to deliver you from the lions?" Daniel then said to the king, "O king, live forever! My God sent his angel and shut the lions' mouths so that they would not hurt me, because I was found blameless before him; and also before you, O king, I have done no wrong." Then the king was exceedingly glad and commanded that Daniel be taken up out of the den. So Daniel was taken up out of the den, and no kind of harm was found on him, because he had trusted in his God. The king gave a command, and those who had accused Daniel were brought and thrown into the den of lions- they, their children, and their wives. Before they reached the bottom of the den the lions overpowered them and broke all their bones in pieces. Then King Darius wrote to all peoples and nations of every language throughout the whole world: "May you have abundant prosperity! I make a decree, that in all my royal dominion people should tremble and fear before the God of Daniel: For he is the living God, enduring forever. His kingdom shall never be destroyed, and his dominion has no end. He delivers and rescues, he works signs and wonders in heaven and on earth; for he has saved Daniel from the power of the lions." So this Daniel prospered during the reign of Darius and the reign of Cyrus the Persian.

I will sing to the Lord, for he is lofty and uplifted; * the horse and its rider has he hurled into the sea. The Lord is my strength and my refuge; * the Lord has become my Savior. This is my God and I will praise him, * the God of my people and I will exalt him. The Lord is a mighty warrior; * Yahweh is his Name. The chariots of Pharoah and his army has he hurled into the sea; * the finest of those who bear armor have been drowned in the Red Sea. The fathomless deep has overwhelmed them; * they sank into the depths like a stone. Your right hand, O Lord, is glorious in might; * your right hand, O Lord, has overthrown the enemy. Who can be compared with you, O Lord, among the gods? * who is like you, glorious in holiness, awesome in renown, and worker of wonders? A reading from 3 John 1:1-15 (NRSV)

The elder to the beloved Gaius, whom I love in truth. Beloved, I pray that all may go well with you and that you may be in good health, just as it is well with your soul. I was overjoyed when some of the friends arrived and testified to your faithfulness to the truth, namely how you walk in the truth. I have no greater joy than this, to hear that my children are walking in the truth. Beloved, you do faithfully whatever you do for the friends, even though they are strangers to you; they have testified to your love before the church. You will do well to send them on in a manner worthy of God; for they began their journey for the sake of Christ, accepting no support from non-believers. Therefore we ought to support such people, so that we may become co-workers with the truth. I have written something to the church; but Diotrephes, who likes to put himself first, does not acknowledge our authority. So if I come, I will call attention to what he is doing in spreading false charges against us. And not content with those charges, he refuses to welcome the friends, and even prevents those who want to do so and expels them from the church. Beloved, do not imitate what is evil but imitate what is good. Whoever does good is from God; whoever does evil has not seen God. Everyone has testified favorably about Demetrius, and so has the truth itself. We also testify for him, and you know that our testimony is true. I have much to write to you, but I would rather not write with pen and ink; instead I hope to see you soon, and we will talk together face to face. Peace to you. The friends send you their greetings. Greet the friends there, each by name.

The Song of Zechariah *Benedictus Dominus Deus Luke 1: 68-79*
