Vespers for Monday in Easter Week

⁵ Then he speaks to them in his wrath, *
and his rage fills them with terror.

Psalm 49 *Audite haec, omnes*

and never see the grave.

Psalm 49 (cont.)

¹⁰ Their graves shall be their homes for ever, their dwelling places from generation to generation, *
though they call the lands after their own names.

¹¹ Even though honored, they cannot live forever; *
they are like the beasts that perish.

¹² Such is the way of those who foolishly trust in themselves, *
and the end of those who delight in their own words.

¹³ Like a flock of sheep they are destined to die; Death is their shepherd; *
they go down straightway to the grave.

¹⁴ Their form shall waste away, *
and the land of the dead shall be their home.

¹⁵ But God will ransom my life; *
he will snatch me from the grasp of death.

¹⁶ Do not be envious when some become rich, *
or when the grandeur of their house increases;

¹⁷ For they will carry nothing away at their death, *
nor will their grandeur follow them.
¹⁸ Though they thought highly of themselves while they lived, *
and were praised for their success,
¹⁹ They shall join the company of their forebears, *
who will never see the light again.
²⁰ Those who are honored, but have no understanding, *
are like the beasts that perish.

The Lessons

A reading from 'Mark 16:1-8 (NRSV)'

When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.
