#### Psalm 50 Deus deorum

- Out of Zion, perfect in its beauty, \* God reveals himself in glory.
- <sup>3</sup> Our God will come and will not keep silence; \* before him there is a consuming flame, and round about him a raging storm.

- <sup>4</sup> He calls the heavens and the earth from above \* to witness the judgment of his people.
- <sup>5</sup> Gather before me my loyal followers, \* those who have made a covenant with me and sealed it with sacrifice.
- <sup>6</sup> Let the heavens declare the rightness of his cause; \* for God himself is judge.
- <sup>7</sup> Hear, O my people, and I will speak: "O Israel, I will bear witness against you; \* for I am God, your God.
- <sup>8</sup> I do not accuse you because of your sacrifices; \* your offerings are always before me.
- <sup>9</sup> I will take no bull-calf from your stalls, \* nor he-goats out of your pens;
- <sup>10</sup> For all the beasts of the forest are mine, \* the herds in their thousands upon the hills.
- I know every bird in the sky, \* and the creatures of the fields are in my sight.
- <sup>12</sup> If I were hungry, I would not tell you, \* for the whole world is mine and all that is in it.
- 13 Do you think I eat the flesh of bulls, \* or drink the blood of goats?
- <sup>14</sup> Offer to God a sacrifice of thanksgiving \* and make good your vows to the Most High.
- <sup>15</sup> Call upon me in the day of trouble; \*
  I will deliver you, and you shall honor me."
- <sup>16</sup> But to the wicked God says: \*
- "Why do you recite my statutes, and take my covenant upon your lips;
- <sup>17</sup> Since you refuse discipline, \* and toss my words behind your back?
- When you see a thief, you make him your friend, \* and you cast in your lot with adulterers.
- <sup>19</sup> You have loosed your lips for evil, \* and harnessed your tongue to a lie.
- You are always speaking evil of your brother \* and slandering your own mother's son.

- These things you have done, and I kept still, \* and you thought that I am like you."
- I have made my accusation; \*I have put my case in order before your eyes.
- <sup>23</sup> Consider this well, you who forget God, \* lest I rend you and there be none to deliver you.
- Whoever offers me the sacrifice of thanksgiving honors me; \* but to those who keep in my way will I show the salvation of God."

#### Psalm 1 Beatus vir qui non abiit

The Lord knows the way of the righteous, hallelujah!

- <sup>1</sup> Blessed are they who have not walked in the counsel of the wicked, \* nor lingered in the way of sinners, nor sat in the seats of the scornful!
- <sup>2</sup> Their delight is in the law of the LORD, \* and they meditate on his law day and night.
- <sup>3</sup> They are like trees planted by streams of water, bearing fruit in due season, with leaves that do not wither; \* everything they do shall prosper.
- <sup>4</sup> It is not so with the wicked; \* they are like chaff which the wind blows away.
- <sup>5</sup> Therefore the wicked shall not stand upright when judgment comes, \* nor the sinner in the council of the righteous.
- <sup>6</sup> For the LORD knows the way of the righteous, \* but the way of the wicked is doomed.

## The Lessons

A reading from 'John 15:1-11 (NRSV)'

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.
